What is Green Camp?

Green Camp Bali is about fun and adventure for young people. Our programs stem from a passion for environmental education and are delivered with an emphasis on Bali's rich cultural and physical landscape.

Location

Green Camp is situated north of Denpasar and Sanur (both 20 minutes) and south of Ubud (also 20 minutes). Seminyak is a 30 minute drive and it is a one hour drive from Nusa Dua.

Accommodation (optional for Adventure campers only)

Green Camp houses students in bamboo yurts on the west side of the campus. Each yurt sleeps up to 4 people.

Amenities

Green Camp operates in the 8 hectare Green school campus. Every structure is constructed bamboo or rammed earth, and the site is maintained year-round. The campus includes:

- » organic gardens providing fruit, vegetables and herbs
- » tropical forest with cocoa for chocolate making
- » papaya and banana trees
- » access to the Ayung river for river ecology activities
- » a natural spring-fed swimming pool
- » learning centres for arts, crafts and workshops
- » a low ropes course
- » a high ropes course
- » stunning rice paddies
- » a covered gym
- » a sports field
- » extraordinary Heart of School building – the worlds largest bamboo building
- » mud pit for teambuilding challenges
- » climbing elements for coconut tree climbing
- » the beautiful bamboo "Da Vinci" bridge
- » a "sky walk" for learning about and tapping palm sugar

FUN Program activities

Circle time	Learn about teamwork and Bali through a series of fun challenges that highlight local artistic and cultural traditions like eating “kerupuk” crackers suspended on strings, balancing baskets, creating Balinese sweets and walking on bamboo “stilts”.
Games	Various traditional games, races and out/indoor team fun
Chanang	Designing, making and offering Chanang (Balinese offerings tray) - introduction to Balinese culture and making a wish for the planet!
Amazing race	Trail search with fun clues on campus.
Bugtastic	Trek around Green Camp grounds and find you very own creepy crawlers and bugs. Learn what they have for lunch and how they catch it. Look under a microscope to see what they look like up real close.
Mpm	Mud Pit Madness in the school’s mud pit. Soft weapons used for “King of MP” game. Blindfold team games, wrestling, etc
Kite-making	Learn to make and decorate traditional Balinese kites from paper and bamboo and participate in a flying festival. And...take the kite home with you!
Forest rangers	Hike through the jungle and study the leaves and plants to learn the secrets of the forest and its inhabitants.
Friendly farms	Learning how to look after farm animals, feed them, pet them...
Low ropes course	Swing, climb and balance your way through Green Camps low ropes challenge carrying a water container that must not be spilled Will your team be the victor and claim the prize of chocolate cookies and fresh fruit juice?
Wayang kulit	Learn about the traditional Indonesian shadow puppetry by making your own puppets, write and produce your own play and use the drums for adding dramatic sound effects.
River explorers	Study the shallow pools of Ayung river; made with nets and microscopes to study fish, frogs and insects. Watch and learn all the weird things they do.
Organic chocolate making	Collect cocoa pods and extract the beans to make organic cocoa powder using traditional methods (i.e. by hand/mortar and pestle – no machines). Using locally harvested palm sugar, we then make chocolate sauce for banana splits!
Art attack	Learn about ancient Indonesian tradition of batik from local artisans. Get hands on with pottery, making paper lanterns or decorating your own t-shirt Green Camp style.
Tubing	Throw your tube in the river, put your helmet, jump on and drift downstream! Choose from sections where you need to dodge boulders and learn how to steer your tube, or others where you can lie back and relax. Competitive campers can join in the tube race.



ADVENTURE Program Activities

Secrets of the sawah	A hike through local rice paddies to explore the life cycle of rice. Scavenger hunts with prizes give those with a competitive streak an incentive to really take a look and then... plant your own rice!
Amazing race	A challenging race in small teams. Groups must solve riddles and clues in order to find their next location and beat the clock to win a prize! Learn about teamwork and Bali through a series of fun challenges that highlight local artistic and cultural traditions like eating “kerupuk” crackers suspended on strings, balancing baskets, creating Balinese sweets and walking on bamboo “stilts”.
Mountain biking	See Bali’s volcano and lakes close up while you navigate your way along ancient paths of Bali’s mountain people. Use your two wheel skills to pick the best line down and beat your friends back to camp!
Raft building & river exploration	Compete in teams in a race to build the fastest raft using nothing but bamboo poles and string. Design and build your own raft, then launch and race it to the finish line, 500 meters down the meandering canal.
Bow making & archery	Learn how to make your own bow and arrows an then compete to be the hot shot on the jungle range.
Coconut tree, rock climbing and rappel	Rock and coconut tree climbing at Green Camp will take you to your limits! And once you’ve scaled our cliffs and mighty palm tress, return to earth the “easy” was with a supervised rappel.
Whitewater rafting and river ecology	Experience the mighty Ayung River for real by paddling down the rapids in an inflatable raft. Follow the experienced guide’s instructions, strap your helmet and enjoy the biggest adrenaline rush.
Mt. Batur sunrise track	Following a midnight drive to Mt. Batur, campers will set off on an adventurous night hike, navigating their way to the summit with the team. The mountain top sunrise will blow campers’ minds! (<i>Overnight campers only</i>)
Low ropes	Swing, climb and balance your way through Green Camps low ropes challenge carrying a water container that must not be spilled Will your team be the victor and claim the prize of chocolate cookies and fresh fruit juice?
Wayang kulit	Learn about ancient Indonesian tradition of batik from local artisans. Get hands on with pottery, making paper lanterns or decorating your own t-shirt Green Camp style.

Green Camp provides

- Lunch and snacks
- Any transportation required during camp, but NOT GETTING THERE
- All materials needed for workshops
- Instructor and guide fees
- Equipment rental (e.g. bike and helmet rental, snorkel rental, etc.)

Optional residential campers

- Breakfast & dinner – often by the fireside
- Yurt with attached bathroom

What's not included?

- Flights to and from Bali
- Transport to Green School campus from hotel, villa or airport
- Costs incurred to obtain visas, passports and passport photos
- Inoculation and other medical expenses
- Personal communications via email and phone
- Laundry
- Taxes (including airport departure tax of 150,000 IDR)
- Travel insurance
- Fees incurred for overweight baggage
- Fees incurred for lost or damaged camp equipment

What to bring?

Remember that we will provide all meals and snacks. If you wish to bring additional snacks such as granola / snack bars, you are welcome to do so.

There is a Green Warung on campus which sells baked good and snacks, - so you may want to bring a little spending money.

DAY PACK: Small, light, nylon bag with straps – such as your school book bag. This is what you'll take with you on day excursions (for residential campers), or simply just to bring your stuff to camp (for day camps). It should be big enough to hold a water bottle, camera, some food, and at least one spare change of clothes.

FOOTWEAR:

Bring closed-toe runners/sneakers to wear in the river, or for climbing a tree and hiking in the jungle. It's also suggested that you bring waterproof sandals or flip flops.



CLOTHING:

- At least 2 t-shirts per day
- 2 pairs of shorts (tough surf shorts are ideal)
- waterproof jacket may be useful in the rainy season

OPTIONAL OVERNIGHT NEEDS

- underwear and sports socks
- long pants or a long skirt
- long sleeved shirt
- warmer top
- bathing suit
- waterproof jacket
- toiletries
- towel or sarong

Water Bottle: purified drinking water available all over the campus.

Sun Screen & Hat: The sun can be strong in the middle of the day

Insect repellent: your choice of either a natural or DEET-related product.

FAQs

How do I know which activities are happening on which days?

If you book for five days, you are guaranteed to get the full green camp experience! If you are booking for less than five days and wish to learn more about the scheduled activities on those days, please call green camp admissions.

Is Green camp safe?

Green Camp has medical staff and vehicle available 24 hours a day in case of emergency.

How do I pay?

Payments will be accepted in cash, wire transfer or credit cards. All children must have their camp paid in full before the start.

What happens if I book and then can't make it?

A refund of program fees (less a 25% admin charge), will be granted if notice of cancellation is received at least 48 hours prior to program start time. If notice of cancellation is received less than 48 hours of the program start time the participant will forfeit the entire amount.

What happens when it rains?

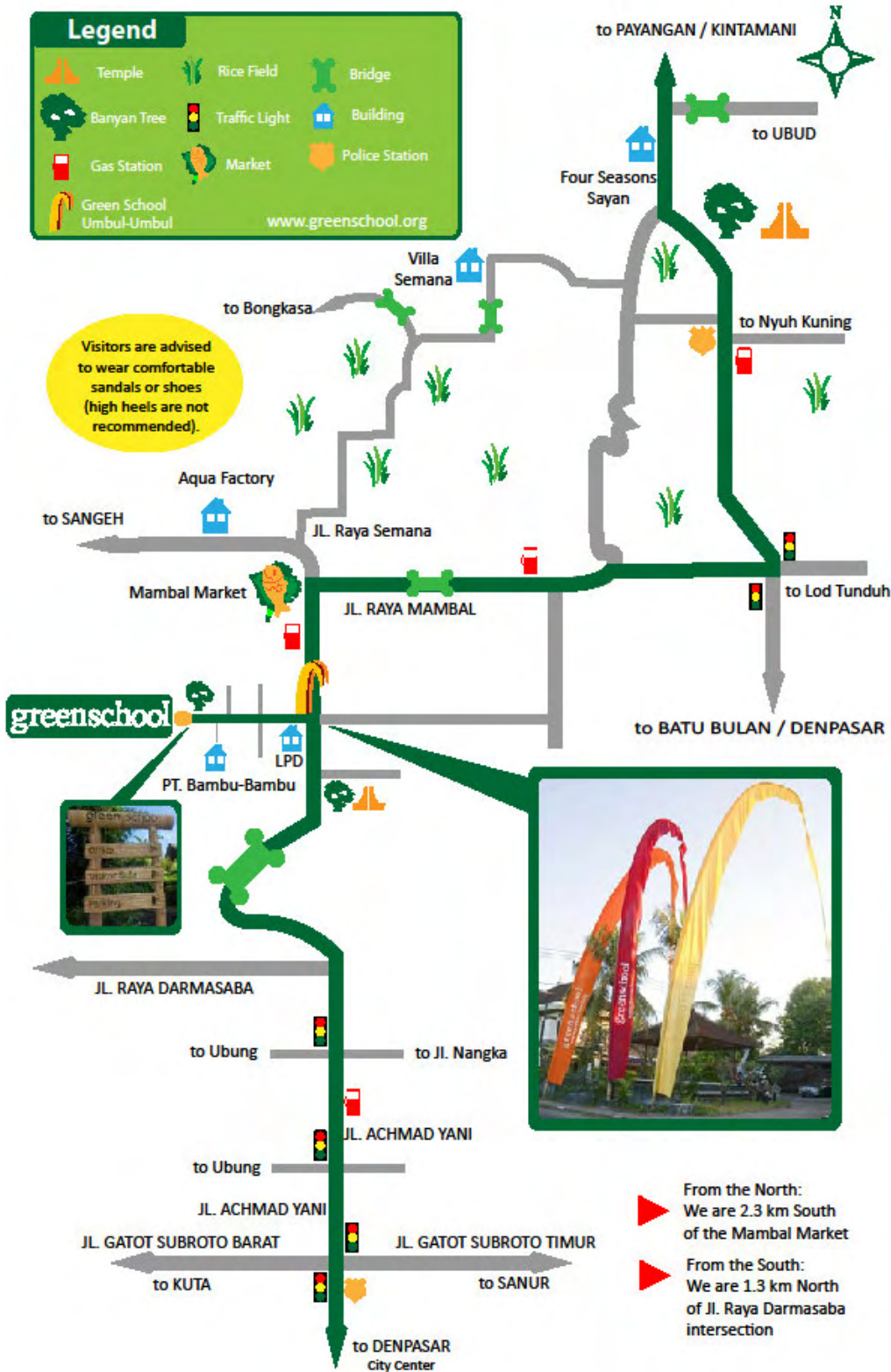
Where is the camp located?
